

Go City Card

The Go City card is a company that offers one stop shopping for many of the attractions in a particular city. You can purchase either the Explorer Pass that allows you to buy 1,2,3 attractions or the GoCity Pass that allows 1,2,3 days of unlimited attractions.

We recommend visiting the website: <https://gocity.com/en-us/how-it-works> to see if they offer the attractions you are interested in before purchasing the discounted ticket through MWR GOTickets or call (617) 671-1000. You will receive a QR code on your email that serves as your ticket to attractions, there are no blackout dates, children ages 3-12 years old and the tickets are valid for 60 days from first use or valid for 2 years unused, from date of purchase.

Boston, Massachusetts

Skywalk Observatory

Located in the Prudential Center, the Skywalk Observatory offers a breathtaking 360-degree panoramic view of the Greater Boston area. Being 52 floors above the city, you have a perfect view of a number of landmarks, including Fenway Park, the Charles River, Harvard University and many more. Active-duty military and dependents receive free admission with a valid ID. For more information, visit www.skywalkboston.com.

New England Aquarium

The New England Aquarium is home to over 20,000 animals from 600 different species. In addition to the number of exhibits throughout the aquarium, there are live animal presentations every day, which help bring visitors up close with the animals. From April to October, the aquarium hosts a whale watch cruise. Most trips will last 3 to 4 hours through the Stellwagen Bank National Marine Sanctuary, which is home to a wide diversity of large whales. Active-duty U.S. military and their dependents receive discounted admission at the Aquarium with valid ID (both active and dependents must have their IDs). Adults receive \$10 off admission and children receive \$5 off. For more information, visit www.neaq.org

Museum of Science

Located along the Charles River, The Museum of Science has over 700 interactive exhibits and features a number of live presentations and shows. It is also home to over 100 animals which have been rescued and rehabilitated. Active duty members receive free admission with valid military ID. For more information, visit www.mos.org

Museum of Fine Arts

The Museum of Fine Arts is the fourth largest in the U.S. and contains nearly a half million works of art. Visitors have the opportunity to experience art from ancient Egypt to contemporary, special exhibitions and educational programs. Boston Duck Tours

Tour Boston on a World War II style amphibious landing vehicle, known as a “DUCK”. Your “conDUCKtor” will narrate your sightseeing tour by a number of landmarks including TD Banknorth Garden, Boston Common, the Prudential Tower, and many more. Tours depart from three locations – the Prudential Center, Museum of Science and the New England Aquarium. The Freedom Trail is a 2.5 mile walk that leads you to 16 historically significant sites. The sites range from museums to burying grounds.
